5 DAY DEVOTIONAL

Day 1 : Exploring Our Roots

Devotional: Understanding the Jewish roots of our Christian faith can deepen our connection with God and enrich our spiritual journey. Day 4: The Promise of Sukkot

Quote: The promise of Sukkoth is the gift of rain. Boy, if you're a farmer or if you're an agricultural, you know how important the rain is, which symbolic of ultimately provision.

Prayer: Lord, thank You for Your provision and faithfulness. Help me to celebrate and rejoice in Your blessings, remembering Your protection and care. Amen.



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Day 5: Unity in Christ

Devotional: God's desire is for His people to unite together as one new man, Jew and Gentile, taking dominion and authority as His ambassadors on earth. This unity is not about legalism but about the glorious grace we have in the Lord. By embracing our Jewish roots and understanding our shared heritage, we can unite in faith and purpose, fulfilling God's plan for His Church.

Verse: His purpose was to create in himself one new humanity out of the two, thus making peace, and in one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility. - Ephesians 2:15-16

Question: How can you contribute to the unity of believers, embracing both Jewish and Gentile heritage in Christ?

Quote: It is God's desire for us, his people, to unite together as one new man, Jew and Gentile, according to Ephesians two, and take dominion and authority being his ambassadors here on earth.

Prayer: Father, unite us as one new man in Christ. Help us to embrace our shared heritage and work together to fulfill Your purpose on earth. Amen.
